Hampton's Healthy Start monitor's the following Goals and Objectives. This monitoring is accomplished through our PIMS database and record reviews.

GOAL # 1: Families enrolled in Healthy Start will achieve positive birth and child health outcomes.

Objectives:

- 1. 85% of prenatal enrollees will deliver babies weighing at least 2,500 grams.
- 2. 85% of participating children will have a medical provider at birth or within 2 months.
- 3. 80% of participating children with a medical provider will continue to receive services from the medical provider.
- 4. 80% of participating children will receive 100% of scheduled immunizations.

Goal # 2: Families enrolled in Healthy Start will achieve positive maternal health outcomes.

Objectives:

- 1. 85% of teen mothers will have no subsequent births or will have an interval of at least 24 months between the target child's birth and the subsequent birth.
- 2. 75% of non-teen mothers will have no subsequent births or will have an interval of at least 24 months between the target child's birth and the subsequent birth.

Goal # 3: Healthy Start will promote optimal child development by screening for suspected delays, referring children for developmental evaluation as indicated, and monitoring and participating in the treatment program for children with identified delays.

Objectives:

- 1. 90% of participating children will be screened for appropriate development semiannually for the first three years and annually thereafter.
- 2. 100% of children with confirmed developmental delay will be monitored for follow-through with recommended services.

Goal # 4: Healthy Start participants will demonstrate positive parent-child interaction, and positive parenting knowledge and behavior.

Objectives:

- 1. 85% of participants will demonstrate positive parent-child interaction or show improvement.
- 2. 85% of participants will have optimal home environments to support child development or their home environments improve.

Goal # 5: Healthy Start participants will not abuse or neglect their children.

Objectives:

1. 95% of participating families will not have a founded case of abuse or neglect after one full year of participation in the program.

During the past years we have worked closely with the Hampton City Schools to determine that Healthy Start's graduates were "ready for kindergarten". We work with the College of William & Mary to conduct periodic evaluations of Hampton's Healthy Families Partnership's success. An annual report is also completed to demonstrate the success of our programs.

Hampton's Healthy Start program receives credentialing from Healthy Families America.
