Trapping must be conducted between the dates indicated above. All wildlife will be released from the trap on site. Borrower may transport cats to the SPCA at 523 J. Clyde Morris Blvd., Newport News, between the hours of 11am to 6pm, Monday through Friday, 10am to 5pm on Saturday or Hampton AC will pick up trapped cats between the hours of 7am and 9pm, if you call 727-6111. You may call 595-1399 for information regarding SPCA acceptance procedures. Notify Hampton Animal Control after transporting animals to the SPCA and whenever traps are left at the SPCA.

Trap Info

- There is no charge for trap usage. Traps are loaned out for a 7-day period. If a longer trapping period is needed, contact ACO, 727-2818 prior to the end of the 7-day period.
- Traps must be clean and in working condition when returned.
- **If the trap is damaged, lost, or stolen the borrower will be responsible for the full replacement value of the trap and criminal charges may be pursued.**
- ***Animal Control has the right to remove traps if regulations are not followed.***

Trap Regulations

- Trap must be checked at least once every two hours. ***DO NOT set trap if you are unable to monitor it.***
- Traps should be placed in a discreet location, away from sidewalks, front porches, or anywhere there is pedestrian traffic. Place the trap in a secluded location, such as under a bush in the shade.
- Traps must be set to protect animals from inclement weather: hot sunlight during summer months or sleet or freezing rain in the wintertime **Trapped animals may not be left out in inclement weather.**
- **Traps may not be set if inclement weather is forecast.**
- Traps may not be set on concrete, asphalt, bricks, or other hard surfaces.
- Once a cat is trapped, cover the trap with a blanket or towel to reduce stress.
- State law prohibits the relocation of trapped wildlife; therefore, any trapped wildlife will be released on site.
- Use disposable bowls or containers to hold bait food.
- Trapped cats being transported by the borrower should ideally be taken to the SPCA within four (4) hours of capture. ***DO NOT transport animals in the trunk of a car***
- **Leaving an animal in a trap for an extended period without notifying Hampton Animal Control may be considered animal cruelty, which can be punishable by fines and/or imprisonment.**

I hereby agree to abide by the laws of the City of Hampton and the requirements set by Hampton Animal Control. I declare that under penalty of law all statements made on or in connection with this application are true and complete to the best of my knowledge. I understand that any violation of these requirements or misstatements or omissions of material fact may cause immediate and permanent revocation of my ability to trap. I give my express written consent for members of Hampton Animal Control to enter onto the property locations listed above at anytime to inspect, to place, or to remove equipment. I understand that the City of Hampton shall not bear responsibility for renter's misuse of traps. The City of Hampton makes no warranties as to traps and I take the trap "as is."

I have read and fully understand the Agreement and its contents. I am aware that this is a waiver and release of liability and an enforceable legal document between me and the City of Hampton.
