A Word from the Director

Although the FGP Program faced many challenges during the 2014-2015 fiscal year I am excited to share that the program achieved 99.9% of Volunteer Service Years. This achievement is attributed to your commitment and the volunteer station supervisors support of the program. To summarize my report to the FGP Advisory Council included; total stipend paid to volunteers were \$226,241.65 and total volunteer service hours 85,522. To show my gratitude for your accomplishments I want share a group hug and say thank you! My full report will be available by August 30, 2015.

As I reflect back on this past year, I am reminded of an article "How to Reverse A Failure" adapted from the Executive Leadership newsletter. The FGP program is not a failure, however, I will say I have made some decisions...both professionally and personally that tested my leadership.

But because I utilized the recommended steps from the article, ultimately these decisions provided an opportunity to enhance my leadership abilities and skills.

It is my belief that if you experience failure, practicing these steps may offer you success as well.

The article stated, when something fails, follow these steps:

1. Look in the mirror. Examine what you did. Ask trusted advisors and colleagues to evaluate you. Ask yourself what you should do differently. You may figure out how to improve your own performance, and when other teammates see you looking in the mirror, they may do the same.

- 2. Go right back to work. Jumping back in to planning and preparation creates a framework for moving forward.
- 3. Communicate directly. Ignored, problems won't go away. Consult team members to find out what's going on.
- 4. Seek other leaders on the team. Appealing to people's sense of pride and ownership is a first step in putting things right. Talk to them about how you need their help to correct course.
- 5. Make necessary changes. Small or large, adjustments will have to be made. Take the steps, make the changes, learn the lessons and do better next time.

Energy Assistance (Cooling Component)

Cooling Assistance is a component of the Energy Assistance Program. The program is designed to provide cooling services to low income households when other resources cannot meet those needs.

APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED UNTIL AUGUST 17TH.

Payments will be made until funds are depleted. **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

- Must meet citizenship and certain income guidelines.
- Must have at least one household member that is <u>under age 6 or age 60 years or older</u>, or <u>disabled as defined</u> <u>by social security guidelines</u>.
- Must have a cooling need.

TYPES OF ASSISTANCE

- Ceiling, attic, or whole house fan purchase/installation or repair
- Air conditioner purchase (installation or self pick up/installation).
- Repair of central air unit or heat pump.
- Payment of an electric bill to operate cooling equipment.
- Once per lifetime electric security deposit payment.
